Southeast Child & Family Services is seeking both Full-Time and Part-Time After-Hours Direct Service Workers for the newly established After-Hours Unit. These workers will report to their unit supervisor and will be responsible for immediate crisis interventions, providing supportive services and assessments for children in need. The workers are to answer all after-hours calls that arise and respond to each with priority based on the urgency of the call, while providing timely and effective assistance and resources to our Southeast Communities and their band members.

- Providing immediate crisis intervention and conducting comprehensive child protection investigations.

- Referring and providing information to professional and community resources.
- Responsible for completing and submitting all required written reports, documentation, after-hours, etc. to the Unit workers within prescribed timelines.
- Working with Southeast Community Members and Community offices.
- Case and file management skills; stress management; time management; and documentation detail (e.g., CFSIS, IM, Word etc.).
- Working in a team-based environment as well as assuming independent responsibilities.
- Participating in Agency events, training, and working flexible hours as required.
- Willing and able to travel as required to meet operational needs.
- Other duties as assigned.

## QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor of Social Work is preferred. Comparable education and experience may be considered.
- Experience conducting investigations including gathering and analyzing information to implement appropriate action(s).
